■ Theme:

National Policies on Overseas Compatriots

■ Background:

- Overseas Compatriots contribute to the socio-economic development of their country of origin by sending remittance and enhance national prestige by people-to-people diplomatic activities. With the increase of international migration, overseas compatriots' affairs emerge as one of the major policy area in many countries.
- As of 2009, there are approximately 6.8 million overseas' Koreans in the world, which is about 14% of the population of the Republic of Korea. Korean government seeks to utilize numerous overseas Koreans.
- This special collection of Global Migration Trends is calling for research papers that examine national policies of each government regarding overseas compatriots to use them for national interests.

- Please provide approximately 500-word abstracts (use the format attached) by June 10, 2011.
- Selected eight candidates will be announced on June 17, 2011.
- Submission of full text should be made by July 30, 2011
  
- Format requirements
  - ① Citation and reference should be inserted as footnote; Papers written in English should be in APA style;
  - ② The length of the paper is A4 15-20 incl. footnote;
  - ③ Previously published papers will not be accepted;
  - ④ Author should provide a biography and CV of contact information in length of 75-100 words.
- Language: Korean or English
- The author of the chosen paper will be paid 400,000KRW.
